

#### What Is Elder Abuse?

Elder abuse refers to intentional or negligent acts by a caregiver or trusted individual that causes harm to an older person. Elder abuse takes many forms, including: • Neglect or Isolation • Physical abuse • Sexual abuse • Financial abuse and exploitation • Emotional or psychological abuse (including verbal abuse and threats)

#### What Causes Elder Abuse?

Elder abuse affects older people across all socioeconomic groups, cultures, and races and can occur anywhere when they are disconnected from social supports:

- In a person's own home
- In nursing homes, assisted living facilities, and other institutional settings
- In hospitals

While any older person is potentially at risk of elder abuse, some are more susceptible to experience abuse or neglect than others. Based on available information, women and people 80 and older are more likely to experience abuse. Factors such as dementia or poor physical health can increase older people's isolation, which in turn puts people at greater risk of experiencing abuse or neglect.

#### SOME COMMON RISK FACTORS:

- Dementia
- Mental health or substance abuse issues of an older person and/or a perpetrator
- Social isolation
- Poor physical health

Many people who experience elder abuse are reluctant to report abuse because they may: • Feel ashamed and embarrassed, particularly if a family member is the perpetrator • Be afraid that the perpetrator will get in trouble • Worry that they will be forced to live in a nursing home—and this sometimes happens • Feel guilty or somehow to blame • Be in denial that the abuse is occurring, or unaware that what they are experiencing is abuse or neglect • Be afraid that if they report, the abuse will get worse

#### How Can We Prevent and Address the Problem? BUILD PUBLIC AWARENESS:

Talk about the issue to increase the identification and reporting of abuse by the public, professionals, and older people who
experience abuse • Provide older people who experience abuse with a safe environment to speak out and tell their stories •
Begin long-term prevention by raising awareness of solutions among students and young people
BE A "SENTINEL"

Keep in contact and talk with your older friends, neighbors, and relatives frequently
 Be aware and alert for the possibility of abuse
 Look around and take note of what may be happening with your older neighbors and acquaintances
 Ask questions and listen

For the 2023 season, eligible participants have their choice from three different options:

- **\$50 produce box:** If you select this option, you will receive a one-time box of in-season, locally grown fruits, vegetables, and honey. Items may include onions, corn, tomatoes, carrots, peppers, peaches, and honey.
- \$25 in coupons and \$25 produce box: If you select this option, you will receive \$25 in SFMNP coupons that you can use at area community farmers market and roadside stands until November 30, 2023, as well as a \$25 produce box of in-season, locally grown fruits, vegetables, and honey.

# 2023 Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program June 23<sup>rd</sup>, 11:00 – 1:00

LifeCare Alliance administers the Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) on behalf of the Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging (COAAA).

This program is funded by the USDA, with additional support from COAAA and the Franklin County Office on Aging.

Annually, the program runs from June 1 through November 30.

#### What eligible SFMNP participants receive

For the 2023 season, eligible participants have their choice from three different options:

- **\$50 produce box:** If you select this option, you will receive a one-time box of in-season, locally grown fruits, vegetables, and honey. Items may include onions, corn, tomatoes, carrots, peppers, peaches, and honey.
- **\$25 in coupons and \$25 produce box:** If you select this option, you will receive \$25 in SFMNP coupons that you can use at area community farmers market and roadside stands until November 30, 2023, as well as a \$25 produce box of in-season, locally grown fruits, vegetables, and honey.
- **\$50 in coupons:** If you select this option, you will receive \$50 in SFMNP coupons that you can use at area community farmers market and roadside stands until November 30, 2023.

This program is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, with additional support from the Franklin County Office on Aging and Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging. Annual program dates: June 1 through November 30.

### **ELIGIBILITY FOR THE 2023 SFMNP PROGRAM**

You are eligible for this program if you are 60 years of age or older AND have an annual household income that is 185% of the poverty level or less:

- 1 person in household, income of \$0 \$26,973 = \$2247.75 monthly
- 2 persons in household, income of \$0 \$36,482 = \$3040.17 monthly
- 3 persons in household, income of \$0 \$45,991 = \$3832.58 monthly
- 4 persons in household, income of \$0 \$55,500 = \$4625.00 monthly

You must also reside within one of the participating central Ohio counties:

- Fairfield
- Fayette
- Franklin
- Licking
- Madison
- Pickaway
- Union

Paper copies of the applications also will be available outside the main entrance of the location where you typically visit to submit your application. Hard copy applications must be received at LifeCare Alliance by June 9, 2023 in order to be guaranteed you will receive your 2023 SFMNP benefit at your county's distribution event. Completed hard copy applications should be mailed to LifeCare Alliance, Attention: **SFMNP, 670 Harmon Ave., Columbus, OH 43223.** 

#### CASE MANAGEMENT

If you typically work with your COAAA PASSPORT, Aetna, or Molina case manager to receive your SFMNP benefits, please contact your case manager directly about applying for the 2023 SFMNP. **HARD COPY AT DISTRIBUTION EVENTS** 

Hard copy applications will be accepted on the day of your county's distribution date. However, if an application is submitted at your county's distribution event, LifeCare Alliance cannot guarantee that you will receive your desired choice of coupons or a produce box.

### HOW TO RECEIVE YOUR 2023 SFMNP BENEFITS

SFMNP applicants are expected to be physically present to pick up their SFMNP coupons and/or produce box at their county's distribution event. See below for a complete list of distribution dates, times, and locations by county. The exceptions to this pick up requirement are as follows:

- If you are unable to be physically present at your county's scheduled distribution date, you are permitted to have a trusted representative pick up your selection for you as a proxy. A person is permitted to pick up for themselves, as well as to serve as proxy/trusted representative for a maximum of two other applicants. If you use a proxy/trusted representative, LifeCare Alliance must have your completed application on file already, OR your proxy/trusted representative must bring your completed and signed application with him/her to the distribution event.
- If you are unable to be physically present at your county's scheduled distribution date; if you do not have anyone who can serve as a proxy/trusted representative for you; and if funds remain after your county's distribution date, you will be contacted about receiving your 2023 SFMNP benefit. If no funds remain following the distribution events, your name will be added to the waiting list in the order in which your application was received originally received.

### IF YOU SELECT TO <u>RECEIVE SFMNP COUPONS</u>, HERE'S HOW THEY WORK

You will receive a list of community markets and roadside stands. Review the list for months, days of the week, and timeframes that area farmers' markets are open.

- Look for the SFMNP posters at individual farmer's stands when visiting community farmers' markets and roadside stands. These posters indicate that a farmer accepts the coupons. Redeem your coupons only for locally-grown fresh fruits and vegetables, fresh herbs, and honey. Baked goods, jams, maple syrup, etc. are not eligible for purchase.
- Select produce equal to the amount of the coupon. No change will be given.





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### **Policies - Members and Non-Members**

#### Membership

Annual membership dues for ages 55+ are \$15.00 for a single and \$20.00 for a couple. As a member you will receive the newsletter "Ragtimes," which showcases current information about the wide variety of free and fee-based programs available. Membership dues are for one year, starting on January 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.

#### Photos Taken by Staff

During programs or activities, participants may be photographed by a staff member of Windsor & Community Seniors, Inc. for publicity purposes. These photos may appear in "Senior Express", on the WACSI web site, or in other publications. If you do not want to have your photo taken and/or published, please tell the photographer. You may also contact the Activities Office at 937-644-8464.

#### **Trip Policy**

A reservation for all trips must be made in advance. The reservation must be paid in full by the advertised cutoff date in order to be able to pay the discounted amount. After the cutoff date, there will be a \$10.00 additional fee added to your reservation. If you find you must cancel a trip, please let the Activities Office know as soon as possible. Please see Refund Policy if you need to cancel your trip and remember we have to pre-pay for all trips.

All travelers <u>MUST</u> submit a File of Life to the Trip Coordinator upon entering the bus. Files of Life will be kept in a locked container and returned to their owners upon arrival back in Marysville. If you don't have this form, stop by the Activities Office and pick one up prior to the trip. In addition, if we are going on a gambling trip, you <u>MUST</u> bring a valid Driver's License or State Photo ID with you or you will not be able to gamble.

In the event of illness or injury that cannot be resolved by basic first aid procedures, the emergency squad will be called. Depending on the recommendation of the EMT, the traveler will be allowed to continue on the trip or be transferred to the nearest hospital by the squad. For those who are able to continue the trip safely, either the designated driver or the emergency squad will be called when the bus approaches Marysville. Who is called will be at the discretion of the Trip Coordinator with input from the traveler. In case of illness or injury which involves medical intervention at a hospital, WACSI will not be responsible for the traveler's transportation back to Marysville. The traveler will have two options:

 Bring the name and phone number of a person whom the traveler contacted <u>prior</u> to the trip to ensure the contact person will be available to transport the traveler; <u>OR</u> 2) use the driver designated by WACSI. The traveler must pay the driver for the round trip (from WACSI to the traveler's home and from their home back to WACSI) using the standard mileage defined by Union County.

<u>A lift bus will be reserved when possible for the accommodation of travelers using a wheelchair or walker</u>. Travelers in a wheelchair will be required to bring an aide of the same sex or a spouse/significant other to assist them during the trip. If a spouse or significant other is used as the assistant, the traveler must have another designated traveler of the same sex to assist him/her in the restroom. If an aide is used rather than a spouse, the traveler will pay the same amount for the aide's trip fee as they have paid for their own fee (regardless of the aide's membership status). If a traveler is able to transfer safely to a seat, they may do so.

#### **Non-Member Fee**

Non-members will pay an additional \$5.00 per trip. No refunds will be given to non-members for cancellations that they initiate. No exceptions.

#### **Refund Policy**

If a participant cancels a trip or activity, his or her seat may possibly be filled from a waiting list (if we have one). In addition, the participant can find a replacement for their seat in order to qualify for a refund. Because our fees are based on minimum participation numbers and are paid to the travel company in advance, refunds must be requested at least 30 days prior to the trip. Consideration will be given to written requests for refunds in cases where there has been an injury or unforeseen problem not within your control. If your written request is approved we will refund as much as possible for the trip after all bills are paid, minus a \$10.00 processing fee. If Windsor & Community Seniors, Inc. cancels a trip, everyone who has signed up and paid will receive a full refund.




